THE FOUR WAY TEST

Rotarians strive to apply the following test to the things they think, say or do:

1. Is it the TRUTH?
2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?

Background

The Four Way Test was developed by Herbert J Taylor in July 1932 to be used as a measuring stick of the ethics of a company for which he was working. Herbert Taylor was a Rotarian and a President of Rotary International in 1954 - 1955.

For many decades Rotary Clubs and Rotarians have used the Four Way Test as an instrument to develop respect and understanding. The Four Way Test has also been used successfully around the world in business, government and schools as an effective measuring stick of conduct and a guide to 'right thinking'.

OBJECT OF ROTARY

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular to encourage and foster:

FIRST The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;

SECOND High ethical standards in business and professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

THIRD The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;

FOURTH The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

Aaron took those members who were interested on a tour through the school and showed us the facilities they have in the various rooms. He explained that using state of the art equipment, kitchens are built to exact specifications from the design stage through to the finished product. He gave us an impressive demonstration on cutting out a kitchen from a sheet of melamine using a CNC machine. During his talk Jeff had to

compete with the noise of a sudden downpour of rain. Vineyard Joinery currently has 20 employees.

Our own Larry Whitbread gave a presentation on the history of the Toyota Corporation. It was originally named after Mr Toyoda of Toyoda Automatic Loom Works and was later changed to Toyota. In 1937, Mr Toyoda's son began making cars and Toyota is now the 12th largest company in the world. Originally imported into Australia by Les Theiss with Australia being the first production plant in the world outside of Japan. Toyota made their first EV in 2009. Toyota's last Australian production was the Camry Hybrid in 2017. A hybrid vehicle can run on both petrol/diesel and electric power.

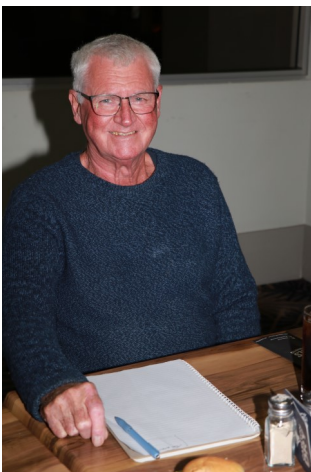

Tribute – Robert Lawrence Witherdin

Sadly missed by family and friends, Bob Witherdin was a valued member of the Rotary Club of Inverell East from 1976 to 2023. He was club President in 1994 and that year was awarded a prestigious Paul Harris Fellowship. Bob's time in Rotary was marked by service – Service Above Self. He was not a man for committees, he didn't look for recognition, he just did things. He was a man of action in his Rotary life and in his personal and professional life.

Bob will always be remembered by his Rotary colleagues for his quiet, methodical and no-nonsense contribution to a vast number of building projects which have greatly benefited communities at a local, district and international level. These included the Campbell Park Rotunda, McIntyre St Aged Care Facilities, the Middle Creek Shelter, the Pioneer Village Storage Shed, the Inverell East Rotary Food Van and, in more recent years, the May St Park Picnic Shelters. At May St, Bob not only assisted with the building but also took Inverell High Construction students under his wing. He taught them how to lay concrete slabs. When Bob spoke, people listened.



His early days in Inverell revolved around his business, R.L & A Witherdin Constructions, his family, Jaycees and Rotary and sport. Bob loved cricket, golf and basketball but it was Rugby League where he established a reputation as one of the toughest back rowers in Country NSW. He played for Inverell, Group 5 and then in 1958 was selected to represent Northern Division to play against the touring Great Britain side in Tamworth. Bob revealed his cheeky, fun-loving side during the days of Jenny Fox's Fashion Parade/Musical charity fundraisers. He strutted the stage with his Inverell East mates, although dressed in a tuxedo rather than the fishnet stockings favoured by Foxy and the South brothers. His other great contribution 'culturally' was the dedicated building work at the Art gallery which helped transform the old building and its surrounds.



Above all, Witho was a family man, adored by his kids and grandkids, lovingly supported by Annette and then Sandra. As David and Sonia wrote in his eulogy "he was so lucky to have been loved by two beautiful and incredible women". In between Rotary service, building, family and sport, Bob was able to travel throughout Australia and the world, make many friends and enjoy life.

We at Inverell east have lost a mate who truly lived the Rotary motto – "Service Above Self". In June 2023 we presented him with an Appreciation Certificate for long service. Then in September 2023, in failing health, Bob received Honorary Life Membership. Robert Lawrence Witherdin was indeed a good man, a gentleman. We will miss him.

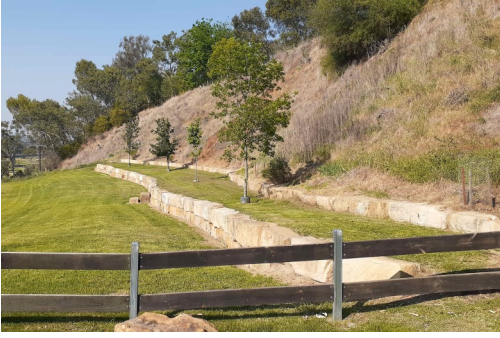
